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This learner was observed by the EQA in an assessment process addressing the totality of interim portfolio performance evidence and referencing/inclusion to meet award requirements.

The assessor clearly defined with the learner the requirements for overall final evidence sufficiency and types of evidence suitable for assessment i.e. observation of on-site practice, witness testimony, product and professional discussion.

The learner was clear on the outcome of the assessment meeting and the suitability of presented evidence addressed, or otherwise. The learner was also presented with a clear action plan going forward supported by SMART target dates.

This was a good assessment review and was fully supported by the centre IQA completing an observation of the process and by separately interviewing the learner.

The learner had completed the majority of online knowledge based assessments for the units comprising this award and was at an interim stage of unit performance evidence gathering.

In view of the learner position, no certification for this award has yet been applied for. This was appropriate.
